



Teaching as an Art Week Summer 2024 Grades 1-8 Materials List REVISED MAY 5, 2024

These items will be used throughout your training so please bring art materials and notebooks to each face-to-face session.

You can save costs if you can borrow an instrument and art supplies from your school or classroom, or go to Mercurius to receive wholesale prices for Gradalis students.

Grades 1 – 8 Total Cost of Materials if New = \$80.00 (Shipping & taxes vary by State) (laptop not included)
(Gradalis provides a resource binder for you to take home with you during Teaching as an Art Week.)

- 1. Working laptop/computer and cord.** (Laptops will not be allowed to be used in the classroom except for specific purposes. Turn off all cell phones during classes.) Laptop is needed on the last day to take the 20-minute Student Survey.
- 2. Bring your school's calendar for 2024-25 for creating your Annual Block Plan and First Main Lesson Block Plan**
- 3. Colored Pencils—Best are Lyra Color Giants pack of 12 (\$21.00 from Mercurius)** for illustrating main lesson books and Gradalis drawing class. Or can get Prisma Colored Pencils from Hobby Lobby or Michaels that are not giant side to sketch in your notes etc. in the training. Also great to have. (\$14)
- 4. Beeswax Crayons** (can borrow from your classroom if allowed by your school)
 - **8 Block Beeswax Crayons** (from Mercurius or Amazon) **(\$19.40)** or borrow from your school/classroom
 - **8 Stick Beeswax Crayons Stockmar (\$19.50) or Filana Organic (\$23.95) from Amazon or Mercurius**
- 5. Visual Arts includes Watercolor Painting, Waldorf Drawing and Clay Modeling.**
 - Bring above beeswax crayons and colored pencils
 - **1 set Non-Toxic Mungyo Soft Pastel Set of 48 (\$8.50 on Amazon) (NEW REPLACEMENT)**
 - 1-inch (#20 or #22) watercolor paint brush (natural bristles). Flat not rounded or pointed. Long or short handle is fine. **(\$11.99 Hobby Lobby or similar)**
 - **Apron** for all Visual Arts to protect your clothing
- 6. Ink pens and pencils for taking notes (\$3.00)**
- 7. Pencil/crayon dual sharpener (\$7.10 at Mercurius) and pearl eraser (\$3.00)** Mercurius has dual ones with 2-hole sizes
- 8. Eurythmy slippers if you have them (optional).** If you don't have these, be prepared to do eurythmy barefoot so you don't slip. (\$15)
- 9. Recorder or Pentatonic Flute (optional but recommended for Music classes)**
 - **Grades 1-2:** Pentatonic Flute (Borrow from your classroom or the School as these are expensive).
 - **Grades 3-8:** Soprano Baroque Recorder (No C Flutes, please) (Cost = \$10.00-15.00 for Yamaha white plastic or pear wood) (Best we've found is the black Angel Halo Baroque Soprano recorder for **\$16.00**)
 - **Grades 6-8:** If you have an alto, tenor, or bass recorder, please bring it. Label with your name. We'll have some on hand to borrow if needed.
 - Purchase at most music stores or online
- 10. Grade 6 Teachers—bring good compass (6" radius), 18" metal ruler, triangle & protractor for geometrical drawing (cost: compass is around \$12 at Michaels etc.)**
- 11. Grade 7 Teachers—bring good compass (6" radius), 18" metal ruler, triangle & protractor for Perspective Drawing (cost: compass is around \$12 at Michaels etc.)**
- 12. A water bottle and any snacks for during class if you wish to eat (Gradalis provides lunch, coffee, tea etc. during breaks.)**

13. Bring Cup for coffee/tea and utensils for lunch (to prevent use of plastic) Thank you. Gradalis provides lunch, coffee and tea. If you require lots of protein, you may wish to supplement the lunch provided. Usually in summer it includes varied salads with grilled chicken or tofu, sandwiches, etc. Good fair but not heavy for summer. Our caterer, Deanna Mikdad, is great!
